PUBLIC RELATIONS

The County Championships and Age Group Competitions held in February and March this year attracted a superb entry and, with the exception of a few swimmers in the long distance events, all swimmers obtained a place in their chosen events.

2008 programme of events will differ from that in 2007 as the two long distance events will be on different days, to allow swimmers to compete in both events, should they wish.

Every year new age group best times are set and 2007 was no exception. 31 girls' events and 20 boys' events now have faster best times. These best times are only recorded at the County Competitions, not at any other events.

Zoe Hester of Reading broke both the Open and Junior County records in the 200m Backstroke event. The Open record had stood for 27 years and the previous record holder Jane Admans (now Radvan) was at the event to present Zoe with her trophy. In the heats of the 100m Backstroke, the Junior record for that event was also broken by Zoe. Mark Harris of Windsor claimed the Open 50m Butterfly record and Bracknell & Wokingham are now the holders of the Mens' 4x100m Medley Team record. Well done to Bracknell & Wokingham, Zoe and Mark.

I have relied on Chris Thomas and her Team for many years and I believe Ken may ask to be put on her list of willing bodies, having been whipping at Region and SCASA for a long time.

I shall miss my Championship organisation work which I started in 1987, but I will continue to help and support the County in as many ways as I can on the occasions when I am available, that is when I am not enjoying life as a spectator, watching the next generation of 'Adams' competing at their County events.

SYNCHRONISED SWIMMING COMMITTEE

Through the year, the new qualifications (Skill Levels) have been obtained by many swimmers, and Reading Royals has played a major part in the provision of facilities and personnel to stage the necessary Assessment Days.

15 October 2006 saw the SER Age Group Championships. At these events, Reading Royals' swimmers were medallists again in all Age Groups. In the 17 & under recreational team event, Bracknell (entering for the first time) took the bronze medal.

The synchro competitive year culminates in the National Championships and the National Age Groups, which were for the first time held together and re-scheduled to the first weekend in December. This major change meant a complete revision of training schedules and, for many clubs, the abandonment of the traditional Christmas Shows which not only showcased a Club's achievements but were also major fundraising events. A further change to the format of National and Regional level Championships is the introduction of two strands, an 'elite' or Competitive strand (for which specified Skill Levels are required) and a Recreational strand (for which Skill Levels are not an entry requirement). It is likely to be some time before even the most competitive clubs will have enough swimmers at the requisite Skill Levels to enter the competitive strand in all age groups.

In the 2006 NAG Championships, the Reading Royals' swimmers repeated most of their successes at SER level, and, in the British Championships, RR took bronze in the team event. This weekend is the time at which various national awards are presented, and this year Phoebe Rumbol of Bracknell was awarded the Gemma Yates Memorial Trophy for endeavour under difficult circumstances.

From the results of the NAGs and a selection day in December, 6 RR swimmers (Katie Clark, Rebecca King, Kristina Holley, Megan Rothery, Rebecca Bates and Hannah Rush) qualified for the National Development Squad.

In May 2007, competitive trials were held for the National Junior and Senior Squads. The Junior Squad was to train full time over 5 weeks and then compete in the European Junior Championships at the end of July. The Senior Squad is, for the first time, to be in full-time training, starting in September 2007, demanding a complete commitment to training for the 2012 Olympics. From Reading Royals, Helen Morris, Jazmine Stansbury and Jenny Godding qualified for the Junior Squad and Katie Skelton, Jazmine Stansbury and Helen Morris for the Senior Squad.

Following on from the very successful Open Novices Competition in 2006, Reading Royals undertook to run Novice Competitions again in 2007. The organisation was more complicated than in 2006 because it included an invitation competition and a

special Duet competition which would feature in a programme in the Childrens BBC 'Do Something Different' series. Everything came together on the day, with 156 swimmers taking part, including the two from DSD, of whom most of the competitors were fans. County results were taken from the competition and honours were divided between Bracknell, Reading Royals and Witney Clubs (the latter, although in ONB, was included by invitation because of the absence of County synchro competitions in ONB). Jane White once again refereed most efficiently. (Results attached.)

2006-7 has also been marked by two other awards of note: Reading Royals 'made history' by being the first synchro club in the ASA to achieve Swim21 accreditation, and Jennifer Gray, an Honorary Life Member of RR, was chosen to receive the ASA's Alfred H Turner Award.

In the Junior Europeans, Jazmine Stansbury (RR) swam the solo, Helen Morris (RR) the duet and both were in the two teams with Jenny Godding (RR). All the swimmers performed most creditably.

Finally, a thank you to all the coaches and officials, committee members and parents for helping to keep synchro surviving as a sport.

WATER POLO

SECRETARY'S REPORT

We seem still to be coming to grips with the new administrative year in swimming! As I mentioned in my report last year, we have moved our ACM forward to September, but we now find that we are a week behind the Region! The Association may feel that this timetable needs to be reviewed, although there seems to me to be absolutely no point in trying to hold our Council Meeting in August, when the Regional and ASA paperwork comes out.

2006/7 has proved a notable year for the Berkshire & South Buckinghamshire ASA. At our suggestion (see the Minutes of the last Council meeting), the Regional Management Board recognised that the boundary between the former Midland and Southern Counties Districts had less relevance in the 21st century and decided to remove any reference to Oxfordshire in our Sub-Region's geographical description. At last, therefore, Berkshire & South Buckinghamshire covers what it says on the tin! We parted with Didcot, Goring Gap, Henley, Henley Leisure, Henley Synchro and Woodcote SCs with mixed emotions, but feel sure that they will be well looked after by Oxfordshire & North Buckinghamshire.

The Regional Management Board urged, last Autumn, that we combine with Oxon & North Bucks to form a sub-region, principally, it would seem, so that county sports partnerships (CSPs) were not "divided" between sub-regions: before the boundary adjustment mentioned above, technically we had dealings with 3 CSPs – Berkshire, Bucks & Milton Keynes and Oxfordshire.

The possibility of this combination has been discussed intermittently over the past 2 years. While, initially, it seemed that there was some support for the proposal, some practical considerations have made an amalgamation less attractive to many. It has to be said that the Region's proposal was not greeted with enthusiasm in either existing county association. Again, this was discussed at the last Council meeting. The Regional Management Board has now decided to let the current sub-regions continue, for the time being, a conclusion welcomed on both sides of the Thames or Latitude 51 37 N. I believe, however, that the Association will have to take its responsibilities as a sub-region seriously, because the Region will be watching what happens in the north of its area closely.

Against that background, the Association has been striving during the year to develop its role as a sub-region. The Association has prepared its first all-discipline development plan, and is working to implement it. Tribute must be paid to the members of the Development Sub-Group, Jean Hulbert and Eddie Lyne, for the progress made. They cannot carry this forward alone, and we are very grateful for the support that the Regional Development Officer, Natalie Cunningham, has provided during the year. In addition, the Partnership Swimming Development Officer (PSDO) for Buckinghamshire & Milton Keynes, Emily Swain, has been tireless in her support for aquatic sports. Sadly, the Berkshire County Sports Partnership has had to release its PSDO, Kayleigh Hodges, so we are presently without the services of a PSDO for the larger part of the sub-region.

One of the focuses of the Development Plan for the current year is volunteer development, and we will be seeking feedback from clubs shortly as to how the Association can help them in this particular arena.

A number of our clubs were already Swim 21 accredited before regionalisation. Those have been re-accredited, where necessary, notably Bracknell & Wokingham SC, who are now accredited in all 4 categories. Enthused by Natalie Cunningham, a number of other clubs are now grasping the nettle, and embarking on the path to accreditation. It is undoubtedly a hard task, but I believe there are many benefits for both clubs and the sport as whole in the exercise, although I would be first to

acknowledge that the benefits are not always immediately tangible! The Association was particularly delighted that Reading Royals SSC became the first synchro-only club to be accredited under Swim 21, nationally. It seems likely that Albatross DC will become the first diving-only club to be so accredited, nationally.

The Association, its clubs and their members continue to play an active part in the various strands of the sport, both in terms of the Region and nationally. Roger Prior, a Past President of this Association, is Chairman of the Regional Management Board, and the Region's substitute member on the ASA Board. I am a Regional Board Member. Sue Green is the Region's Trophies' Controller. Eileen Adams has a pivotal role in the Region's [speed swimming] Championships. Susan Harrison, another Past President, is a member of ASA's Audit & Probity Committee. It could be said that Berks & South Bucks continues to punch above its weight beyond its boundaries!

However, I do have concerns about the future of the Association as a sub-region. You will see elsewhere in the agenda for the Council Meeting that we have not been blessed with a full slate of nominations for the various offices. Now, I know that some incumbents have already indicated that they are prepared to serve again, having overlooked submitting their nomination papers by the closing date. That said, there are, potentially, some very serious vacancies, which need to be addressed smartly. Not least of these are the vacancies for Hon Championships Secretary and Assistant Championships Secretary. Eileen and Ken Adams gave notice a couple of years ago that they were standing down. There has not been a rush of nominations from persons wishing to succeed them. I am concerned that, with no Championships Secretary, there will be no Championships ... After all, the County is an association of clubs.

I would like to take this opportunity to pay tribute to Eileen and Ken, who have looked after the Championships, with aplomb, for many years. To many of our swimmers, the County events are the apogee of their swimming careers, and it's a credit to Eileen and Ken particularly that these events have been so successful, despite the very minor irritating glitches that occur from time to time.

I could, of course, rant on further for pages about issues affecting the sport in our County – the inadequacy of pool provision, the lack of certainty about future provision, the lack of suitable time in the pools which do exist, the difficulty of keeping competitors involved in the sport beyond the ages of 16 or 18, the apparent reduction in the willingness of people to volunteer, the economic difficulties facing any young person wanting to coach an aquatic discipline in the Region – the list could be endless. But you would get bored, anyway!

So, I will conclude with some tributes and obituaries.

Sadly, in the past year we have lost Hubert Prescott, who was President in 1973, and Hon Treasurer from 1974 to 1977, and Mary Wilkinson. Mary, the mother of our President, Janet Hopkins, and wife of Wilkie, was a Honorary Life Member of the Association, and was twice awarded the President's Plate for service to the County – in 1975 and 1985. Although Mary may never have been elected President, many of

us realise that she was the power behind the throne in 1965, 1966 and 1987, when Wilkie was President!

Janet accepted the rather sudden call of the Past Presidents to take up the office of President, and I am sure that you will all join me in thanking her for so doing. I feel sure that she is enjoying her presidential year (or, unfortunately, 10 months) and is certainly discharging her duties expertly.

I would also like to thank Rosemary Large for her work as Assistant Secretary, and my wife, Sandra, for putting up with me and my involvement with swimming. Those of you who know her will have spotted that her love of the sport is rather less obvious than mine ...
